### 279/13. Planning

13/01161/HOU - Construction of extension over existing garage and extension to hall to form bedroom at 2 Cross Farm Court. The Parish Council raised no objections. 13/01222/FUL - First floor extension over single storey structure to form holiday cottage at Shaw Top Barn Shaw Lane. The Parish Council raised no objections in principle to the first floor extension but suggested to the applicants present that they should consider having a chimney built on the roof of the extension in keeping with sections 4 & 5 of the Oxenhope Village Design Statement.

The following decisions were noted:

Permission granted – 13/00258/HOU – Construction of bay window and French doors with raised flagged area to front at 5 Station Road

Permission granted – 13/00454/FUL – Construction of two detached dwellings at grid reference 403596 434574, Denholme Road

Refused planning permission - 12/04408/HOU - New access way at 71 - 73 Denholme Road. It was noted that planning permission had already been granted to convert 69 - 75Denholme Road into five dwellings together with garages and that this permission should not have been granted without first considering a suitable new access to these new dwellings and garages.

Refused planning permission - 12/05041/FUL - Wind turbine at Bodkin, Bodkin Lane

### 281/13. Bio-diversity study

**Resolved:** That an in-depth bio-diversity study for Oxenhope is kept in mind when work begins on the Oxenhope Neighbourhood Plan. The Clerk was requested to mention the study in the Annual Report as there maybe someone interested in the village willing to undertake it. It was suggested that the Parish Council could offer this study to a university student.

#### **Resolved:**

Cllr Ashcroft added that consideration needed to be given for those allotment holders wishing to move from one site to the other.
- c) To agree to submit a £500 funding bid to Skipton Building Society Big 160 Appeal to develop the new Keighley Road Allotment site. Cllr Hopkinson to draft the bid.

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# **Resolved:**

- a) To note the e-mail dated 2<sup>nd</sup> April received from Cllr Graham Mitchell, Chairman of Keighley Town Council's Watch & Transport Committee re Black Moor Road. At this point it was agreed to minute that members of the Parish Council were grateful to local farmers for clearing some of Oxenhope's highways after the heavy snowfall in March and to private individuals who dug out less abled/elderly neighbours. It was agreed that Cllr Cameron should discuss the contents of Cllr Mitchell's e-mail at the next Worth Valley Joint Transport Committee meeting.
- b) To note the e-mail and attachment dated 2<sup>nd</sup> April received from Ian Horsfall in response to the Parish Council's request for updates to planning enforcement cases. Cllr Cameron confirmed that he had requested a further update from Ian Horsfall.
- c) To note the e-mail dated 22<sup>nd</sup> March received from Martyn Burke in response to the Parish Council's e-mail dated 21<sup>st</sup> March re planning application 12/04979/FUL. Agreed that the Parish Council should respond following the inconsistent approach adopted by the Planning Department in refusing the new access way at 71 73 Denholme Road (planning application 12/04408/HOU).

# 285/13. Reports

**Resolved:** To receive the following reports:

- a) School Governors. Cllr Ashcroft confirmed that the next School Governors' meeting would be held on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2013 and that the 77 applications received for next year's Reception Class would be considered at this meeting.
- b) Oxenhope Tour de France Committee. Cllr Ashcroft confirmed that he would be attending the Welcome to Yorkshire Tour de France road-show on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> April and would feedback information from the roadshow at the next Parish Council meeting.
- c) Allotments. Cllr Bedford confirmed that fifteen names remained on the waiting list.
- d) Oxenhope Youth Club. Cllr Cusdin reported that the Youth Club is now open to all secondary school age children and as a result attendance numbers had increased.
- e) Rights of Way (RoW). Cllr Hindley confirmed that RoW Department were concentrating their efforts to improve the North Beck route to Goose Eye. Other works locally had been thwarted by the recent wintery weather conditions. The RoW Department had confirmed that 'they will do what they can' to the two footpaths from Heights to relieve the muddy stretches, and relieve the mudddy flooding on the footpath from Ducking Stool Corner to Hoyle.
- f) Oxenhope Community Centre. Cllr Maw confirmed that the AGM did go ahead as planned on 14<sup>th</sup> March and officers were elected at this meeting. Cllr Maw reported that he had been re-elected as Chairman and that a new Treasurer had been appointed. Efforts were being made to re-establish a full complement of committee members and any volunteers would be welcome. The main funding bid would be submitted at the end of April.

# 289/13. Minor items and items for the next agenda

# Minor Items:

- a) A concerned resident had written to the Clerk requesting that the Parish Council address the problem of a landowner burning general waste, wood, caravan bedding, plastic, plastic foam and rubber on the owner's land adjacent to 20 - 22 Denholme Road. At this point of the meeting Cllr Cusdin declared a discloseable pecuniary interest and left the meeting. It was agreed by the remaining members of the Parish Council that Cllr Hopkinson draft a letter to the Assistant Director Environmental & Regulatory Services enquiring why an abatement notice was not issued. Cllr Cusdin then returned to the meeting.
- b) Cllr Cusdin reported that the Oxenhope Straw Race Committee could face a £700 charge from Bradford Council for clearing up after this year's Straw Race. The Committee were actively seeking volunteers to assist this year's clear up to avoid the charge.
- c) Mr Goulding shared with members of the Parish Council his recent Oxenhope online Facebook wall post, namely 'Can I make people aware of the danger to cattle of letting dogs foul footpaths through fields (or in fields, where dogs are let run free). Many dogs in this area carry the Protozoan Pathogen, Neospora. Although harmless to dogs it is passed to cattle through dog faeces. Once infected the cow remains infected for life and is in many cases unable to carry a full term pregnancy, most miscarry at three months. The only option is to cull the cow at a cost of up to two thousand pounds. Many herds can show up to 50% infection rates. Neospora cannot pass between cows and needs the dog as a host. Please clean up after your dog!' It was agreed that CIIr Cusdin should mention this on her page of the Annual Report.
- d) The Clerk was requested to obtain a quote from CJH Electrical to repair the lighting at the Denholme Road telephone kiosk.
