Oxenhope Village Council has a vacancy and is calling on residents, passionate about their community to consider joining the Council.



What do councillors do?

Parish Councillors are the champions of their community and give residents a voice on the decisions the council makes. Becoming a councillor will allow you to make a real difference in your community by engaging with residents, local groups and businesses to find out their needs; making decisions on which services and projects the council should take forward; and getting involved locally to ensure the services are meeting Oxenhope's needs.

What's Involved?

Oxenhope Village Council meets monthly, on an evening. In addition to routine Council business we are currently developing a Neighbourhood Plan for Oxenhope, working with appointed planning consultants and volunteer residents. We are also working with residents through a Friends of the Rose Garden Group and we are currently progressing purchase of the Horse Shoe Dam.

Can I stand?

There are only a few rules to stand as a local Councillor. You must be:

- A British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union
- 18 years of age or older
- Live in or within 3 miles of Oxenhope
